Program Features

Curriculum Delivery

- Courses follow a traditional semester format – 16 weeks in fall and spring, 12 weeks in summer
- Courses are primarily taught online, but may include some synchronous class sessions held in real time with the option to attend from a distance via videoconferencing technology
- Optional on-campus opportunities to gain hands-on experience running simulations
- Practicum sites and supervisors are arranged by students and can be completed in your home community within Indiana, allowing you to develop relationships that may lead to future employment opportunities

On-Campus Attendance Requirements

- MSN Orientation Day (held the week before classes begin)
- Approximately five on-site lab days in the Advanced Physical Assessment course
- MSN Professional Practice Day (held the final spring semester)

Tuition (2018-2019)

- In-state graduate tuition: \$550 per credit hour
- Out-of-state graduate tuition: \$1,507.50 per credit hour
- Tuition for students residing in states that participate in the Midwest Exchange Program (IL, KS, MI, MN, MO, NE, ND, OH, WI): 150% of in-state tuition

Scholarships and Financial Aid

- IUSON participates in the federal **Nurse Faculty Loan Program, which provides up to \$35,500 in funding per academic year, and up to 85% loan forgiveness** after four years of full-time employment as nursing faculty at an accredited school of nursing
- Over \$700,000 in scholarships are awarded annually to undergraduate and graduate students. Students are considered for all scholarships for which they are eligible via a single application
- Research and teaching assistantships are offered each semester that allow students to gain valuable experience and earn a tuition waiver for one course in exchange for 6-8 hours per week of work
- Students enrolled in at least four credit hours per semester are eligible for federal direct student loans (up to \$20,500 annually)

Admissions

Admission Criteria

- A BSN degree from a CNEA, CCNE, or ACEN accredited program
- A cumulative undergraduate GPA of 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale
- A current, unencumbered RN license issued by any of the 50 U.S. states
- Completion of an undergraduate statistics course from a four-year university with a B- (80%) or better (Applicants may be admitted without having met this prerequisite, but it must be met before enrolling in the MSN program)
- Knowledge, skills, and abilities to use a computer and other technologies to communicate

Application Materials

- Electronic IUPUI graduate application
- Contact information for three professional references
- Supplemental questionnaire
- Responses to five short essay questions
- A detailed resume
- Proof of your RN license
- Official transcripts from all postsecondary institutions attended outside of the IU System

Admission Timeline

- Admission is offered one time per year, for the fall semester
- Applications open August 15, 2018 for the Fall 2019 admission term
- To guarantee consideration of your application for the fall cohort, you must submit a complete application by the **priority application deadline of January 15, 2019**
- Admissions decisions are sent out in mid-March for applicants who apply by the priority application deadline
- Applications received after the priority application deadline will be considered as space in each track allows—please see our website for which tracks are still accepting applications
