Program Features

- Courses follow a traditional semester format – 16 weeks in fall and spring, 12 weeks in summer
- Courses are taught online with some live class sessions held in real time via videoconferencing technology (schedule of live classes is posted weeks in advance)
- Optional opportunities to come to campus for hands-on learning experiences
- Class sizes are small to ensure each student receives individualized attention and feedback
- Practicum sites are arranged by students and can be completed in your home community in Indiana, allowing you to develop relationships that may lead to future employment opportunities
